

Operating Guide 7 (OG7) *Update* 14 Jan2019

The Pass-2-Load OG7 Operating Guide and tanker checklists have been revised in order to meet new legislation in NSW and new oil company safety guidelines required from the 1st Jan 2019.

NSW Tanker-Trailer Stability Control

New South Wales Environmental Protection Authority from 1 January 2019 demands that all heavy-vehicle dangerous goods tank trailers used in NSW must have a functioning roll stability system (RSS) also known as Electronic Stability Control (ESC) and It will be unlawful to: operate, drive, load; and/or consign a dangerous goods heavy vehicle tank trailer without RSS/ESC.

- Tanker-trailer owners/operators will be required to confirm if their tanker-trailer is or is not fitted with stability control, doing this in the SLP vehicle compliance program (VCP).
- Authorised Inspection Locations (AIL's) are required to verify the tanker-trailer owner/operators declaration made in the VCP. SLP provides details in the latest OG7 version 3.3 in how a tanker-trailer can be verified for RSS/ESC.

Compartment Internal Inspection

Oil industry has requested that Authorised Inspection Locations when conducting a Pass-2-Load inspection, confirm that



compartments are internally clean, free of dirt, scum or heavy staining and verify that internal stains cannot be dislodged by mopping or scrubbing the surface or the stain.
